Random Musings

These first two months at Hillview have truly flown by. I have appreciated the strong turn-out for the Meet the Pastor small groups. (If you didn't make it to one of those and want to have a chat, just let me know!) I've listened and talked with dozens of you now. I've checked in with all the church boards and committees I have discovered. I'm getting a feel for who you are, individually and together, as the church on Ustick. And, I have fallen in love with Hillview. There is much goodness here!

Your Church Council, the Discipleship Task Force and the Staff/Parish Relations Committee have charged me with a task in the coming weeks. I will be taking my listening and observations and doing my best to create a list of tenets for Hillview—a document that lists descriptively, in brief statements, how we understand ourselves and our shared ministries as followers of Jesus Christ. You will be given NUMEROUS opportunities to comment, amend, add, delete and discuss these agreements so that ultimately, they will reflect not MY understanding of Hillview, but the church's understanding of itself.

These tenets will then become a framework of accountability for us-- for instance, if our tenets say something about how welcoming and open we are, we ask ourselves if our priorities and activities reflect that. If our tenets say something about how we work to deepen our relationships with God through Christ, we ask if our programming, preaching, classes, etc. point to the importance of this.

The tenets can become a tool for helping us make decisions about how we spend our money and what ministries we choose to support or emphasize. So, if we are considering taking on a new ministry or mission project, we can look to these agreements to see if it fits in with how this church community understands its work in the world.

The tenets can be a simple way for us to let people know who we are—what distinguishes us as a church in Boise. We can slip this little document into any welcome packet and a person will know right away what they might expect to experience here.

I can share with you from my personal experience in my last appointment that this can be a powerful exercise and a very effective tool for us. It proved to be useful in all kinds of planning and visioning AND visitors commented that they found it very helpful.

These won't be written in stone, like the Ten Commandments. We can and will revisit and revise them from time to time. Please watch for opportunities to be part of this conversation and join in. Your perspective and input is VITAL.

Hillview BBQ

Marinated Carrots

Dorothy Friend

Cook 6 cups sliced carrots until barely tender; drain.

Heat:

1 can tomato soup	1/2c salad oil
3/4 c vinegar	1 tsp. Salt
1 tsp. Worcestershire	1 c sugar
1 tsp. Mustard	1 tsp. Pepper

Cut up 1 small onion and small green pepper; add to cooked carrots. (these amounts can vary if you wish more or less).

Pour heated sauce over carrots, onion and pepper; let stand in refrigerator overnight or longer. Sauce may be used second time for about 3-4 cups of carrots.

Can add 1 can French cut green beans. (I do this when I make this dish)
