

I have no doubt she will be open-minded, open-hearted and patient when she arrives.

I am certain many of you will begin to notice things you have grown accustomed to that could be refreshed or amended or even discarded. It is natural for your pet peeves and passions to surface when change is afoot. I have no doubt you will be patient, open-minded and open-hearted as you share your perspectives.

I am certain that while it will be difficult in some ways for all of us to say goodbye, we will be able to do so with joy and thanks. Five years of sharing laughter and grief; of working, praying, worshipping and growing side by side; of making decisions that shape our common life as followers of Jesus--we have done this with such open minds, open hearts and patient spirits. LGBT Christian Connection






Vacation Bible School

Invitation to the Romans

Exploring how people have interpreted Romans through the ages is a good lens to view the history of Christianity itself. Compare what Paul writes in Romans to what theologians like Augustine, Luther, and Calvin say in trying to understand Paul in their time. At the end of this study your group will have a more informed commitment to Paul's radical vision of God's relationship to both Christians and Jews and to their relationship to each other, thanks to the "love of God in Christ Jesus."

The weekly video segments first present text read aloud against a backdrop of a wide variety of church settings followed by a conversation between a church historian and a church theologian about the text. The second weekly video is led by storyteller, Michael Williams, who shares snapshot views of how Romans has been read through history.

Thank you to every person who makes this place so special. Thank you for reminding us that it’s OK to be an “uncomfortable Christian.” Thank you for giving our family—at long last—a true church home.
