We know that our denomination, like so many others, is divided around human sexuality. It is not divided around an “issue.” People who are LGBT are not “issues.” They are not more inclined, nor less inclined to sin than anyone else. If God values us or rejects us because of our sexuality, I believe that is not a God, but a god. God calls us to love everyone and to judge no one. Ideally there would be no need for Reconciling congregations, since we are to love as God loves. But we also know that we do not live in an “ideal” world.

We will have opportunities this spring and summer to be witnesses to God’s love. This Sunday, on Easter, Debbie Mallis will take pictures of our congregation to include in a congratulations card for Portland First United Methodist Church. They will celebrate their 25<sup>th</sup> year of being a Reconciling congregation on April 15. Please sign the card in the Gathering Area.

On April 28 at Nampa First United Methodist Church, from 1:00 to 5:00, our bishop has invited all United Methodists in the Treasure Valley to engage in Table Talks. The topic will be human sexuality and will help prepare us for the special General Conference in February 2019. As the only Reconciling congregation in Idaho, it is important for us to attend!

Another opportunity will be on April 29, following our one 10 a.m. service that day (it is a fifth Sunday). We will have a finger food lunch, and then a panel discussion from 11:15 to 12:30. The panel will be people who are transgender and family members. The suicide rate in the transgender community is over 40 percent! We will be able to ask questions and discover how to provide support. I spoke with a transgender woman last month at the Cathedral of the Rockies. I told her about our congregation, and how we stopped supporting a longtime ministry because of the way they treated a transgender church member. She cried and said that she wished she had been supported with so much love.

Another opportunity will be on Saturday, June 16, during Annual Conference. This year our Annual Conference will be in Boise during Pride Week. All the participants have been invited and encouraged to walk with our congregation in the Pride Parade! They will bring their church banners and show that the United Methodists in Oregon and Idaho love all God’s children. Please put this on your calendar and plan to walk with our bishop and district superintendents, and United Methodists from throughout our Conference.

Our mission at Hillview United Methodist Church is to live the teachings of Jesus as we share God’s unconditional love. Together, let’s live that mission!

We told of two missionaries serving in the Democratic Republic of the Congo with “Wings of Caring.” The mission provides air transportation support for this region that has very few paved roads in an area three times the size of Texas.

Now we are traveling to the west coast of Africa and visiting Liberia. Here at Ganta, you will find Dr. Albert G. Willicor, a missionary with the Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church. He is Chief Medical Officer of the Ganta United Methodist Hospital. This mission provides quality and affordable healthcare in the rural north to a population of 450, 000.

We have purchased one from each category but did not receive **50 Women Every Christian Should Know**, by Michelle DeRusha. This book sounded like an interesting, thoughtful book for a group or book study. **Adventure of Ascent, Field Notes from a Lifelong Journey**, by Luci Shaw, is our Spiritual Growth selection. For most of us, growing older is a reality we try to put off, but then we realize—shockingly—that it happens anyway. We immediately

look around to see how others on the path just ahead of us are dealing with it. Here is the intrepid Luci Shaw, taking you on a virtual hike with steps more deliberate and slow but also with surprising vistas that fill us with gratitude. In this book, Shaw serves as a fearless and eloquent scout.

### ***Table Talks: Finding a Way Forward Together*** **April 28 at Nampa First UMC, 1-5 p.m.**

Bishop Elaine JW Stanovsky is inviting United Methodists in the Alaska, Oregon-Idaho and Pacific Northwest Conferences to participate in Table Talk conversations on human sexuality, the upcoming report of the Commission on a Way Forward, and special called session of the General Conference in February 2019. The conversations will be held in various settings across the Greater Northwest Area.

#### What to Expect at Table Talks

The Table Talk design allows for a safe place for conversations about topics that may be difficult or divisive. According to Dr. Marcia McFee, noted worship designer and leader, “Surrounding the conversations in worship is a way to ground ourselves in the story of our faith and our own hearts.”

Before entering discussion, participants will be invited to commit to a simple covenant. In short, the covenant asks them to: (1) Stay Curious, (2) Be Kind, and to (3) Listen with the same amount of passion with which they want to be heard. While it is intended that all Table Talks provide a place to grow in understanding, each conversation will take on a certain character of its own. It is intended that they take place in districts, church clusters, ethnic caucuses, and within other groups and existing networks. Some Table Talks may include 40-50 persons while others may be relatively small in number. The questions and beliefs of participants will inevitably shape the conversation to some degree as well.

## *Milk and Cereal for Corpus Christi*

### THANK YOU

In July 2016 a call went out to the congregation to donate milk and cereal to those who use Corpus Christi House for assistance during the day. The church committed to donating 10 gallons of milk and 4 large bags of cereal every week to provide breakfast for these individuals. Since that time, many of you have brought milk and cereal to meet the need. Some commit to bringing it every week, others once a month, and some bring as they are able.

As a congregation, we have contributed approximately **700 gallons of milk** and approximately **250 bags of cereal**. On most Mondays, when Hillview's "milk man," Ken Miller, arrives, there is no milk available for breakfast and very little cereal. The kitchen manager has often commented how much the milk and cereal is appreciated by Corpus Christi. The individuals who utilize the services also have expressed their thanks to Ken and willingly help carry the supplies into the kitchen.

We may think, "What difference am I making with just one gallon of milk and a bag of cereal?" Together WE

are making a difference, each week, with each gallon of milk, each bag of cereal. Together, WE can make a difference for one person, then another person and so on.

Keep up the good work. Thanks so much to each and every one of you! There's a sign-up sheet on the table in the Gathering Area. If you forget to sign up but still want to donate milk and/or cereal, your donation is happily received.

## *Let's Recycle!*

Are there any electronic, digital, or other electronic devices in your or your family's future this holiday season or beyond? Looking for a safe place to dispose of your old mobile phones, TVs, computers, and other "e-devices" cluttering your closets, garages, or elsewhere in your home? *Please DON'T throw them into the trash!* These discarded items, known as "e-waste," can be toxic when dumped in our landfills. *DO recycle your e-waste!* Hillview's Faith in Action team is creating a new way for all of us to keep any toxic e-waste out of the landfill and recycle it instead.

You'll find an "e-waste" recycling bin next to the Corpus Christi bin in the Gathering Area. Because of the kinds of electronics that often become surplus after Christmas, our first round of e-waste recycling will focus on such items as laptop computers, mobile phones, and other personal electronic devices. But we can also ensure larger items will be safely recycled—and that any personal information on any devices will be wiped clean. Depending on demand, we'll take all of these devices but also other waste each quarter, as Hillview's e-waste recycling program grows.

Your FIA team visited Recycle Boise (4725 N. Glenwood in Garden City (208-871-9432 and [www.recycleboise.com](http://www.recycleboise.com)) and was pleased to learn about the kinds of items that can be recycled. Examples include batteries, cable boxes, cell phones, circuit boards, computer boards and towers, hard drives, laptops, flat-monitor (LCD) screens, telephone equipment, and all things metal or electronic. Recycle Boise, which serves churches, home consumers, businesses, schools, hospitals, and others, is also an "E-Stewards" ([www.e-stewards.org](http://www.e-stewards.org)) certified recycler. Join us in keeping bad stuff out of our landfill! Hillview already "rocks" in recycling our trash and other waste, so here's a chance to take it to another level while cleaning out your garage or basement.

To recycle larger items such as TV sets, appliances, vehicles, and almost anything else that contains metals, or for information on how to safely dispose of toxic waste such as paints, other chemicals, or light bulbs, contact Ken Miller at 208-322-2609 or at [kenmiller@cableone.net](mailto:kenmiller@cableone.net).
